Dr. Joerg Herrmann graduated from Ruhr University medical school in Bochum, Germany and completed his internal medicine residency and cardiovascular diseases and interventional cardiology fellowship at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN. Thereafter, he joined the division of cardiovascular diseases at Mayo Clinic Rochester, and is a Professor of Medicine at the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine. He serves as the director of the Cardio-Oncology Clinic and the research director of the Ischemic Heart Disease program. His research interests focus on all aspects of cardio-oncology and the pathophysiology, diagnosis, and treatment of atherosclerosis. He has published over 200 articles in peer-reviewed journals, including all major cardiology journals and general internal medicine journals such as the New England Journal of Medicine as well as basic science journals such as Cell Metabolism. He has continuously been funded by the NIH since 2013 and is currently receiving NCI funding for a randomized clinical trial in breast cancer patients undergoing trastuzumab therapy. He is a contributor to Braunwald's Heart Disease and the editor of two Cardio-Oncology books, including a companion book to Braunwald's Heart Disease. He also serves as Associate and Section Editor for the European Heart Journal, International Journal of Cardiology, Trends in Cardiovascular Medicine, Current Cardiovascular Risk Reports, Frontiers in Cardiovascular Medicine, and PracticeUpdate Cardiology.
